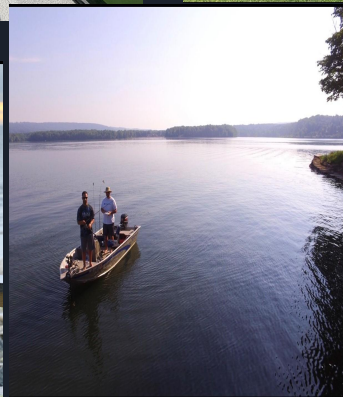

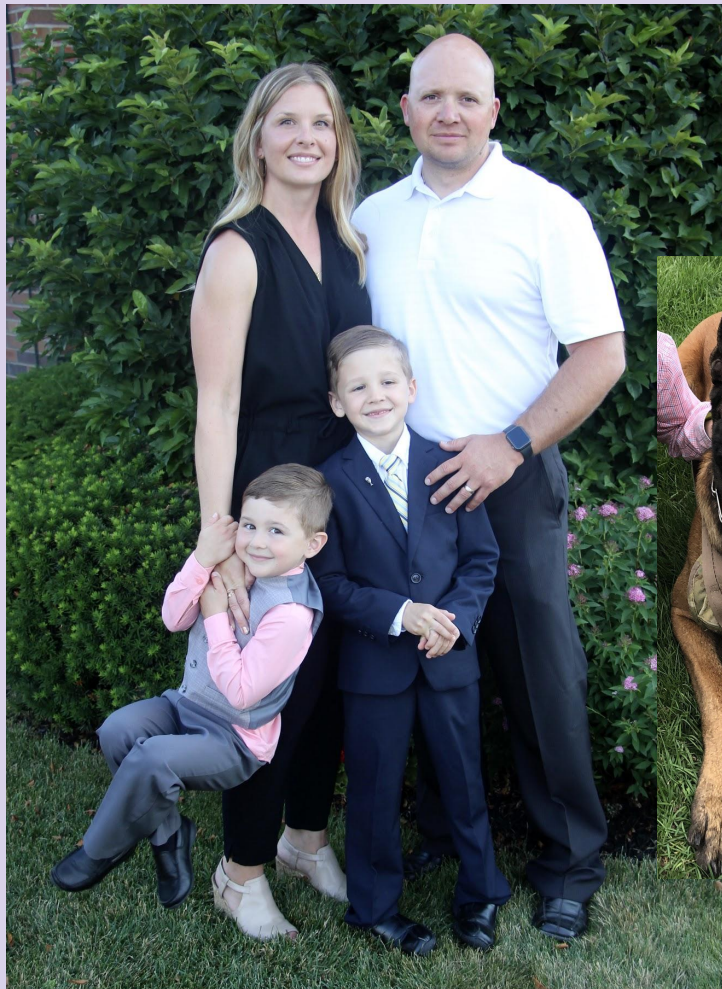

Specific COVID Information

HEALTH SCREENING SURVEY: must be completed everyday by 8:00 a.m.

Mask: Masks MUST be worn on the bus and in common areas such as hallways.

Specific COVID Information (con't)

Arrival - Parent Drop Off:

- It is important when dropping students off to school in the morning that you adhere to the times and locations:
 - GWF- 8:30-8:45 - Center Lane in front of school
 - HPE- 8:30-8:45 - Gym Entrance

Arrival – Bus

- Masks must be worn on the bus the entire time.
- Students will have assigned seats
- Busses will be arriving at schools between 8:45 – 9:00 am

Specific COVID Information (con't)

Dismissal – Parent Pick-Up

If your child is not on the everyday pick-up list and you need to pick up your child you must call school prior to pick-up so that we can have your child ready to go and walk them out to your car. **WE WILL NOT TAKE ANY LAST MINUTE PICK-UP CALLS AFTER 2:00.**


- Those parents who are picking up their child/children from school will receive an HP Golden Knights Car Tag
