



Do you know you can check your accounts such as Google, Facebook, Instagram, etc. to see how much the provider knows about you? Google, for example, stores your name, email address, birthday, gender, phone number and country. It collects data on what videos you watch, ads you click, your location, device information, IP address and more. Online services will tell you they do this in order to make their services work better for you. While this may be partially true, you may want to consider how else your data (and your children's data) is being

 Use Caution on Social Media Sites
 Social networks like Facebook, Twitter and LinkedIn are gold mines of personal information for cybercriminals trying to gain access to your financial accounts or other personal information, so it's important to be aware of what you're sharing and who you might be sharing it with.
Be Cautious of Who You Friend. Many password-reset questions can be answered by someone scouring your Facebook page. Be what you post on open sites such as Twitter as they can be viewed by anyone

- The Guardian pointed out in October that every audio command made using a Google app is recorded and can be accessed and played back by visiting your activity settings Hackers can tap into your online accounts to steal your credit card numbers and ID.
 - Don't Post Birthdays, Your Address, or Any Personal Information. The more you share, the easier it is to materialize enough of your identity to do damage or fool you into believing a phishing email is legitimate. Never Post Your Work or Home Phone Number. Cybercriminals could call you and ask for passwords in a seemingly credible manner if they have the right information. It's never OK to give out your password, but there are other questions they might ask to help them set what they want. When in doubt, go with your gut. If something seems off or you don't know the person, ask for their contact information and look into it. Ultimately, it's better to be safe than polite.
