Nook and Kindle Policy

The middle school library has both Barnes & Noble Nook (2) and Amazon Kindle eReaders (3). The high school library 4 Amazon Kindle eReaders. The Nooks are pre-loaded with *Bull Run* by Paul Fleischman and *Pride and Prejudice* by Jane Austin. We look forward to purchasing a variety of additional titles if there is an interest. For now, any book that is available in the MidYork Public Library System as an ebook is downloadable onto either the Nook or the Kindle with a two-week lending period. The title will automatically disappear from the device when the two-week lending period expires. Parental Controls are set on the Kindles so that students may not browse for books at Amazon.com, download books, or play games. It is simply a method for storing and reading the downloaded title electronically.

The advantages of the eReaders are that multiple books can be stored on one, lightweight, portable device. Also, there is a built-in dictionary that easily provides definitions to words when the user simply highlights the word in the text. The screen display does not emit light (it reads like paper) which is better for the eyes than looking at a computer screen or the displays on mobile devices. Pages are easily bookmarked, and comments can be stored for literary discussion later. Another helpful feature is the ability to enlarge the text for the visually impaired.

In order to lend a device to a student with lending privileges in the library, we are asking for parent permission and a student signature in understanding that the property of the Holland Patent School Library will be replaced at the borrower's expense if lost or broken.

Device: \$80 (or a replacement device of equal value)

Device cover: \$10 (or a replacement of equal value)

Devices will be given fully charged and in a box with a charging cable. The expectation is that the device is turned off when not in use in the student's possession. Charges last substantially longer than for mobile device batteries.

The librarian should be made aware of any damage prior to the return of the eReader and must be handed directly to the library staff and not returned in the book return drop.
