### A Message from the Food Service Director

#### Free Meals for ALL children!

The USDA has extended the waiver that allows school lunch programs to offer a free breakfast and lunch to all students, regardless of income eligibility. This will remain in effect for the entire 2021-22 school year.

#### Free & Reduced School Meal Applications

While all students will receive their meals at no cost, it is still recommended that you complete a free and reduced meal application if you feel you may qualify based on household income. This is important because eligibility has more benefits than just a free meal!

<u>Fee waivers:</u> Student free and reduced-price meal eligibility can be shared with other programs with parental consent for the purposes of fee waivers, scholarships and more.

<u>P-EBT benefits:</u> If extended, households may be eligible for pandemic-EBT benefits.

<u>School benefits</u>: School districts receive state and local funding based on the number of students eligible for free and reducedprice meals.

If approved, your child's free or reduced-price benefit, based on the meal application you submitted this year, will carryover up to 30 operating days into the 2022-23 school year.

As the weather begins to change, we will be faced with deciding on opening, delaying or closing school due to the weather conditions. We understand the ramifications these decisions have on our families; however, our top priority is the safety of our students.

#### HOW THE DECISION IS MADE

- Information on road conditions from transportation staff, Town Highway Supervisors and Superintendents, neighboring School Districts and other sources.
- Amount of snow and ice accumulated.
- Whether precipitation is continuing.
- Building conditions (such as whether we have electricity and heat).
- Status of our buses.
- Weather predictions.
- What other districts are doing. We share information with other local districts and check whether they are opening or closing.

#### WHO MAKES THE DECISION?

The Superintendent is responsible for the final decision, based on the above factors.

#### HOW IS THE PUBLIC NOTIFIED?

Parents of students attending the District will receive automated phone, email and /or text messages through our ParentSquare messenger Automated Notification System. **Please be sure all of your contact information is updated.** Also, tune to WKTV, WUTR, WFXV, WPNY, WIBX, WSKS, WSKU, WBGK, WBUG, WUTQ, WVTL, WTLB, WSYR, WTLB, WBRV, WLLG, WRUN, WFRG, WODZ, WLZW, WTLB, WOUR, WIXT, WTVH, WSTM and Spectrum News for information on school closings. You can also check our district website at www.

#### WHEN IS THE DECISION MADE?

hpschools.org for information.

When possible, we make the decision by 5:30 a.m. (or earlier) so that we can activate ParentSquare, notify radio and TV stations and post the decision on our website.

#### WILL WE CLOSE SCHOOL IF CONDITIONS WORSEN?

If conditions worsen throughout the day, the District will decide whether to proceed with an Emergency School Closing. Please be sure your family Emergency School Closing Plans are in place and contact information is updated with the District.

#### WILL SPORTS STILL BE SCHEDULED?

No. Once we close, **all** afterschool and extra-curricular activities are cancelled.

We encourage our parents to always assess the situation as well and determine if their child should stay home or board the bus. We hope this information assists our families in better understanding all of the factors which go into school closings and know that your child's safety is our number one concern.
